## The visit

- Parking we have a coach parking space on Highfield Street opposite the Synagogue
- Welcome please bring your class to the Heritage Centre door (not the main Synagogue door) where you will be greeted by one of our Ambassadors
- Toilets we have toilets on both floors of the building. If a child needs to visit one of these during the session please ensure a member of staff accompanies them.
- Food strict rules around kosher food mean that no food or drink is to be taken into the Synagogue. If a child requires a drink or snack, bottled water or fruit can be consumed in designated areas. Please speak to one of the team at the Synagogue about this.
- Accessibility the building is accessible for wheelchairs and an elevator can be used by those with mobility issues
- Behaviour and Supervision Whilst at the site, please ensure that your students are supervised at all times. Please follow the staff to student ratios that can be found in our risk assessment.
